## STATEMENT.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that we, J. W. JENKINS & SON, a firm domiciled in Kansas City, Jackson county, State of Missouri, and doing business at No. 615 Main street, in said city, have adopted for our use a Trade-Mark for Guitars and Mandolins, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact specification.

Our trade-mark consists of the arbitrary word "Harwood." This has generally been arranged as shown in the accompanying facsimile, in which it appears, in plain black capitals, in one side of a double-lined triangle; but other forms and styles of type may be employed, or it may be differently arranged or colored, without materially altering the character of our trade-mark, the essential feature of which is the word "HARWOOD."

The trade-mark has been in use continuously in business by us since August, 22, 1885.

The class of merchandise to which this trade-mark is appropriated is musical instruments, and the particular description of goods comprised in such class on which it is used by us is guitars and mandolins.

It has been our practice to mark our trade-mark on the inside of the guitars, on cross-bar under the sound-hole, and on end of neck-block inside the guitar, and on under side of the end of neck between the pegs or machines of both guitars and mandolins with steel stamps, the impression made being burned in or having that appearance.
