DESIGN FOR A GUITAR-BODY.

SPECIFICATION forming part of Design No. 30,985, dated December 11, 1900.

Application filed April 25, 1899. Serial No. 34,004. Term of patent 14 years.

To all whom it may concern:

Be it known that I, **JOSEPH HENDERSON BEHRE**, a citizen of the United States, residing in the city of Leavenworth, county of Leavenworth, and State of Kansas, have invented and produced a new and original Design for a Guitar-body, of which the following is a full, clear, and exact description.

Reference is to be had to the accompanying drawings, forming part of this specification, in which similar characters of reference indicate corresponding parts in both views.

Figure 1 is a plan view of a guitar-body, showing my design; and Fig. 2 is a side elevation of the same.

The design in its entirety consists of a body appearing flat looking on the face, having arms extending nearly parallel with the neck and extending nearly the same length.

The body is shaped in the following described manner: 4 is the front or face of the

body; 5, the back; 6, the sides; 11, the neck, and 13 sound-holes. 4 or front is straight on its face. 5 is parallel to 4 from 7 to 7 and breaks toward face 4 from 7 to 8 and again from 8 to 3.

The leading feature of my design consists of a guitar-shaped body with arms extending from the upper end of the body, with a neck and finger-board appearing between side arms.

Having described my invention, what I claim as new, and desire to secure by Letters Patent, is—

The design for a guitar-body as herein shown and described.

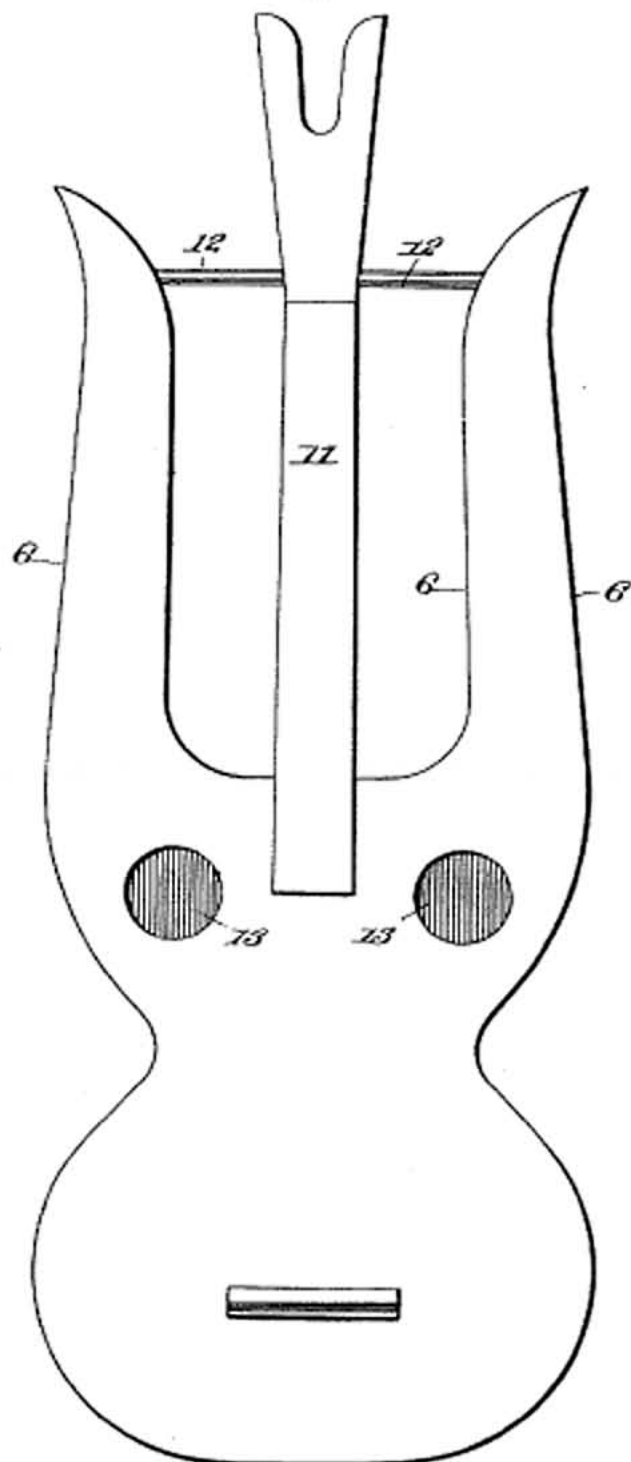
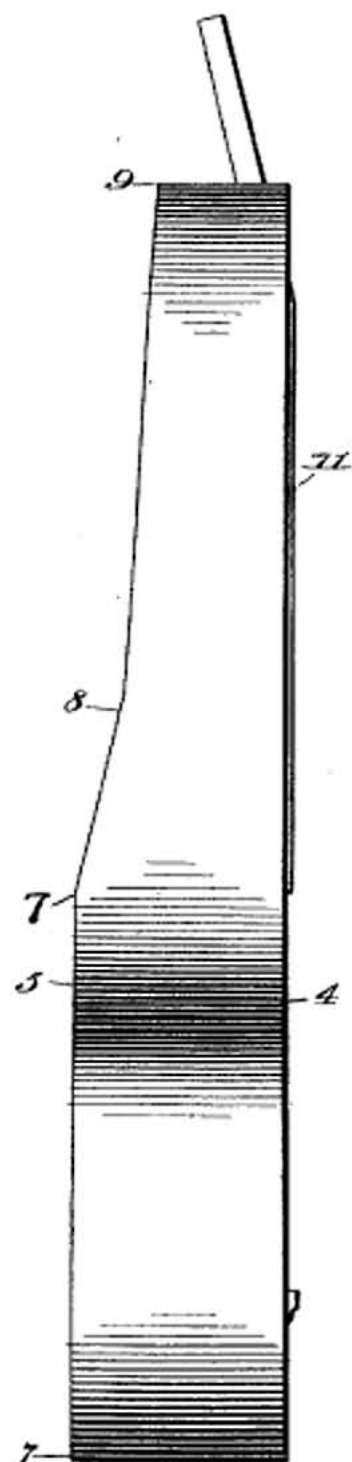
